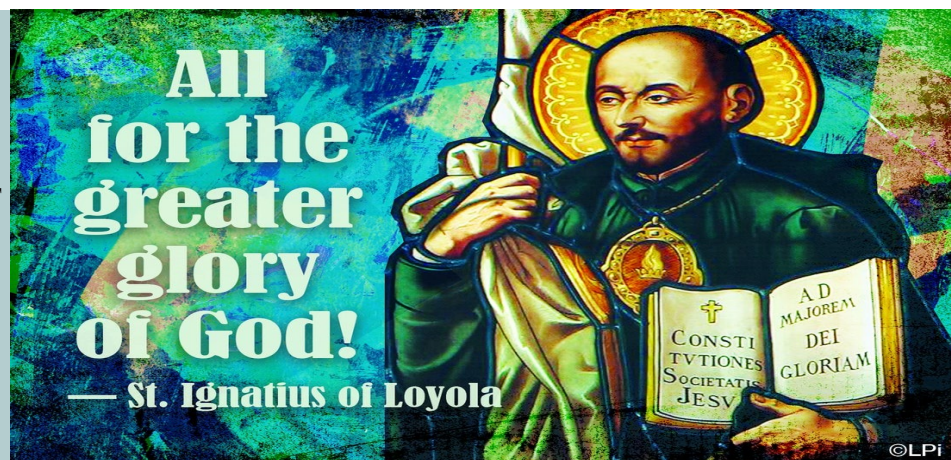

OUR HUMAN RESPONSE TO CHARITY

Our readings this weekend give us a picture of how we respond to the needs of the poor. The First Reading presents us with a situation calling for Charity. There was a famine in Gilgal. The people had nothing to eat. As a result, some died, and others became sick. It was this time that the man from Baal-halisha brought 20 loaves to Elisha. Filled with compassion, he asked his servants to give it to the people. Though he was going through some sufferings, he did not keep any to himself but asked his servants to give all to the people. By so doing, he saved a lot from dying and the Lord blessed his generosity.

Similarly, in today's Gospel reading, a great multitude had gathered to hear Jesus, no doubt because they were hungry for the word of life. Jesus' disciples wanted to send them away at the end of the day because they did not have the resources to feed them. But filled with compassion and pity for the people, Jesus, the *Bread of Life*, abandoned his needed rest and took the little they had - five loaves and two fish donated by a little boy - and giving thanks to his heavenly Father, distributed them to all until they were satisfied of their hunger.

These readings present us with six persons that can be made into two characters: Elisha, Jesus and the little boy on one hand, and the servants of Elisha, Philip and Andrew on the other hand. While one character is ready to give no matter what, the other character has some hesitations. Which one of the characters represents you: the one who believes that the little we give can make a difference or the one who believes that there is nothing we can do because what we have is not enough?

Generally speaking, our response is often demonstrated by a sense of pity. Pity is an expression of concern and good wishes but does not go beyond that. But pity is not always enough. This is what we see in the Gospel today. When Andrew and Philip were concerned about the hungry crowd and prayed to Jesus to send them away because they do not have enough to feed them. James discredits pity. James in his letter says that it is not always enough to have pity on the poor but to do something to help them (James 2:15-16).

In other words, what is needed is not pity but compassion. Compassion on the other hand does not judge but feels. It looks at the need standing before one with the eyes of faith. It sees the needy as one created by God and does not discriminate. It understands that everyone is in need but there are people in most need. Poverty or lack of the necessities of life humbles us – and makes us seek God of providence. But it can harden us and make us doubt God. It takes compassionate people to give to tell the needy that God cares and loves.

Jesus has revealed to us the generosity and love of our Father in heaven. When God gives, he gives abundantly. As imitators of Christ, we are not to dwell in grief and fall prey to self-pity over our illness, misfortune, poverty, suffering or even death of a beloved one. We are to rise up and do something to feed and to feed others. We are to do something by speaking out against evil or injustice or by advice or giving alms. We should not be afraid that we do not have enough. The good news today is that it does not take being wealthy to help the poor. All it takes is love and faith. Faith believes that something can be done; if we cannot see what is done, we can do what can be seen.

Commitment: The generosity of the small boy challenges us. So, devise ways to share from your abundance with others.

NUESTRA RESPUESTA HUMANA A LA CARIDAD

Nuestras lecturas de este fin de semana nos dan una idea de cómo respondemos a las necesidades de los pobres. La Primera Lectura nos presenta una situación que pide la Caridad. Hubo una hambruna en Gilgal. La gente no tenía nada para comer. Como resultado, algunos murieron y otros se enfermaron. Fue esta vez que el hombre de Baal-halisha le llevó 20 panes a Eliseo. Lleno de compasión, pidió a sus sirvientes que se lo dieran a la gente. Aunque estaba pasando por algunos sufrimientos, no guardó ninguno para sí mismo, sino que pidió a sus siervos que se lo dieran todo a la gente. Al hacerlo, salvó a muchos de morir y el Señor bendijo su generosidad.

De manera similar, en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, una gran multitud se había reunido para escuchar a Jesús, sin duda porque tenían hambre de la palabra de vida. Los discípulos de Jesús querían despedirlos al final del día porque no tenían los recursos para alimentarlos. Pero lleno de compasión y piedad por la gente, Jesús, el *Pan de Vida*, abandonó el descanso que necesitaba y tomó lo poco que tenían - cinco panes y dos peces donados por un niño pequeño - y dando gracias a su Padre celestial, los distribuyó a todo hasta que se saciaron de su hambre.

Estas lecturas nos presentan a seis personas que se pueden convertir en dos personajes: Eliseo, Jesús y el niño por un lado, y los siervos de Eliseo, Felipe y Andrés por el otro. Mientras que un personaje está listo para dar pase lo que pase, el otro personaje tiene algunas dudas. ¿Cuál de los personajes te representa: el que cree que lo poco que damos puede marcar la diferencia o el que cree que no hay nada que podamos hacer porque lo que tenemos no es suficiente?

En términos generales, nuestra respuesta a menudo se demuestra por un sentido de lástima. La lástima es una expresión de preocupación y buenos deseos, pero no va más allá. Pero la lástima no siempre es suficiente. Esto es lo que vemos hoy en el Evangelio. Cuando Andrés y Felipe estaban preocupados por la multitud hambrienta y oraron a Jesús para que los enviara porque no tenían suficiente para alimentarlos. Santiago desacredita la lástima. Santiago en su carta dice que no siempre es suficiente tener compasión de los pobres, sino hacer algo para ayudarlos (Santiago 2: 15-16).

En otras palabras, lo que se necesita no es piedad, sino compasión. La compasión por otro lado no juzga sino que siente. Mira la necesidad que se presenta ante uno con los ojos de la fe. Ve al necesitado como alguien creado por Dios y no discrimina. Entiende que todo el mundo está necesitado, pero hay personas más necesitadas. La pobreza o la falta de las necesidades de la vida nos humilla y nos hace buscar al Dios de la providencia. Pero puede endurecernos y hacernos dudar de Dios. Se necesitan personas compasivas para dar para decirles a los necesitados que Dios se preocupa y ama.

Jesús nos ha revelado la generosidad y el amor de nuestro Padre celestial. Cuando Dios da, da en abundancia. Como imitadores de Cristo, no debemos vivir en el dolor y caer presa de la autocompasión por nuestra enfermedad, desgracia, pobreza, sufrimiento o incluso la muerte de un ser querido. Debemos levantarnos y hacer algo para alimentar y alimentar a otros. Debemos hacer algo hablando en contra del mal o la injusticia o dando consejos o dando limosna. No debemos tener miedo de no tener suficiente. La buena noticia hoy es que no se necesita ser rico para ayudar a los pobres. Todo lo que se necesita es amor y fe. Fe cree que se puede hacer algo; si no podemos ver lo que se hace, podemos hacer lo que se ve.

Compromiso: La generosidad del niño pequeño nos desafía. Por lo tanto, dispositivos para compartir su abundancia con otros.

MASS ATTENDANCE OBLIGATION

As of July 1st, 2021, the current dispensation from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation was lifted. Livestreaming of Mass is made available only for those who cannot attend Mass due to sickness or disability on Sunday. So, the moral obligation to attend and participate in Mass cannot be fulfilled by watching livestreaming for those who are healthy.

OBLIGACIÓN DE ASISTENCIA A MISA

Por lo tanto, la obligación moral de asistir y participar en la Misa no se puede cumplir viendo la transmisión en vivo para aquellos que están sanos.

RE-OPENING GUIDELINES FOR PARISH OFFICES AND MINISTRIES

I am happy to inform that the Diocese of San Bernardino re-opens effective July 6, 2021, all parish offices, parish ministries and related programs/activities may reopen fully, operating under guidelines contained herein. The following changes will be implemented immediately by any group wishing to begin praying in any of the Church facilities in our parish.

Changes to Capacity/Social Distancing Regulations

1. Seating for Ministry worship, events/activities held within parish church should be spaced at three (3) feet.
2. Seating for ministry events/activities held within parish church, hall, school classrooms, meeting rooms, etc should be spaced at three (3) feet.
3. When reserving rooms for meetings/ministry activities, attendance numbers should be considered.

Changes to Sanitizing/Hygiene Protocols

1. "Deep" cleaning before and after each service is no longer necessary.
2. Each group is to sanitize seating at the conclusion of regularly scheduled service.

Changes to Mask Requirement

1. Masks are no longer required, indoors, for vaccinated persons. *Parishioners are encouraged to wear masks, if health conditions exist, or as a personal choice, to ensure maximum safety/precautions for all.*

Ministry Meetings/Workshops/Trainings

2. Ministry programs may hold pre-scheduled meetings within meeting rooms, if and only if the three (3) feet social distancing can be maintained.
3. Whenever possible, ZOOM meetings are strongly preferred.
4. No **indoor** parish-wide workshops, training sessions or concerts – where registration is open to the larger community are not permitted at this time.
5. **Outdoor** workshops, concerts or training sessions with such 'open registration' are permitted, subject to the three (3) feet spacing for seating.

Hospitality/Social gatherings within Ministries

1. Pre-packaged/boxed hospitality is preferred.
2. Catered/served lunches are permitted; servers/caterers must wear masks and gloves when filing plates and serving those in buffet lines.
3. No self-serve buffets are permitted; potlucks are permitted, if one person assembles plates and serves attendees; masks and gloves must be worn by server, whether serving indoors or outdoors.
4. No masks are required outdoors by attendees at such events.
5. Three (3) feet social distance seating for these events is required, both indoors and outdoors.

Praying and holding hands

1. Refrain from holding hands with other members when saying any prayer.
2. Greetings will be expressed among members without any physical contact or touching.
3. Kissing/touching of Sacred Objects/Statues not permitted in a prayer meeting.

Other Recommendations

1. Singing by Cantors/Choirs: No restrictions
2. Singing by Assembly: No restrictions
3. No open flames outdoors, at any time.
4. If money is to be collected, the collector should wear mask and glove.
5. In all this, **vaccination** is highly recommended for members to freely pray and sing together.

PAUTAS DE REAPERTURA PARA LAS OFICINAS Y MINISTERIOS PARROQUIALES

Me complace informar que la Diócesis de San Bernardino reabre a partir del 6 de julio de 2021, todas las oficinas parroquiales, ministerios parroquiales y programas / actividades relacionados pueden reabrir completamente, operando bajo las pautas contenidas en este documento. Los siguientes cambios serán implementados inmediatamente por cualquier grupo que desee comenzar a orar en cualquiera de las instalaciones de la Iglesia en nuestra parroquia.

Cambios en las regulaciones de capacidad / distanciamiento social

1. Los asientos para la adoración del Ministerio, los eventos / actividades que se llevan a cabo dentro de la iglesia parroquial deben estar espaciados a tres (3) pies.
2. Los asientos para eventos / actividades ministeriales que se llevan a cabo dentro de la iglesia parroquial, el salón, salones de la escuela, las salas de reuniones, etc. deben tener un espacio de tres (3) pies.
3. Al reservar salón para reuniones / actividades ministeriales, se debe considerar el número de asistentes.

Cambios en los protocolos de higiene / desinfección

1. Ya no es necesaria una limpieza "profunda" antes y después de cada servicio.
2. Cada grupo debe desinfectar los asientos al finalizar el servicio programado regularmente.

Cambios en el requisito de la máscara

1. Ya no se requieren máscaras, en interiores, para las personas vacunadas. Se anima a los feligreses a usar máscaras, si existen condiciones de salud, o como una elección personal, para garantizar la máxima seguridad / precauciones para todos.

Reuniones / talleres / capacitaciones ministeriales

2. Los programas del ministerio pueden llevar a cabo reuniones pre-programadas dentro de las salas de reuniones, si y solo si se puede mantener el distanciamiento social de tres (3) pies.
3. Siempre que sea posible, se prefieren las reuniones ZOOM.
4. No se permiten talleres, sesiones de capacitación o conciertos en el interior de toda la parroquia, donde la inscripción está abierta a la comunidad en general, no están permitidos en este momento.
5. Se permiten talleres al aire libre, conciertos o sesiones de capacitación con tal "registro abierto", sujeto al espacio de tres (3) pies para los asientos.

Hospitalidad / reuniones sociales dentro de los ministerios

1. Se prefiere la hospitalidad empaquetada / en caja.
2. Se permiten almuerzos atendidos / servidos; los meseros / proveedores de catering deben usar máscaras y guantes al llenar los platos y servirlos en las filas del buffet.
3. No se permiten bufés de autoservicio; se permiten comidas compartidas, si una persona prepara platos y sirve a los asistentes; El servidor debe usar máscaras y guantes, ya sea que sirva en el interior o al aire libre.
4. Los asistentes a tales eventos no requieren máscaras al aire libre.
5. Se requieren asientos a una distancia social de tres (3) pies para estos eventos, tanto en el interior como en el exterior.

Rezando y tomados de la mano

1. Abstente de tomarse de la mano de otros miembros cuando digas cualquier oración.

Los saludos se expresarán entre los miembros sin ningún contacto físico o contacto.

3. Besar / tocar objetos sagrados / estatuas no está permitido en una reunión de oración.

Otras recomendaciones

1. Canto de cantantes / coros: sin restricciones
2. Canto por asamblea: sin restricciones
3. No hay llamas abiertas al aire libre, en ningún momento.
4. Si se va a recolectar dinero, el recolector debe usar máscara y guantes.
5. En todo esto, la **vacunación** es muy recomendable para que los miembros recen libremente y canten juntos.

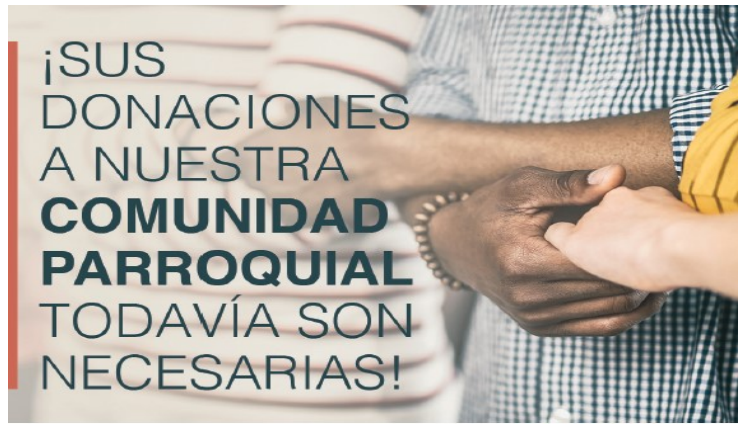

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Re-Opening Guidelines for Worship

Effective June 19, 2021, all parishes within the Diocese of San Bernardino may operate under the sacramental/liturgical/worship guidelines contained as follows:

1. Vaccinated persons may not wear masks in Church.
2. Ushers/volunteers/extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist are strongly encouraged to wear masks when serving.
3. Those serving Communion may now say: "The Body of Christ" to each communicant who then responds, "Amen."
4. Altar Servers can resume – no restriction.
5. Bulletins: No restrictions
6. Hospitality: No self-help; servers continue to wear masks and gloves.
7. Physical Distance: Three (3) feet separation recommended.
8. Offertory: No restrictions
9. Our Father Recitation: Refrain from holding hands with the other person.
10. Private Prayer/Devotion: No restrictions
11. Recessional: No restrictions
12. Sign of Peace: Permitted without any physical contact or touching.
13. Singing by Cantors: No restrictions
14. Singing by Choirs: No restrictions
15. Singing by Assembly: No restrictions
16. Visits to Homebound: Permitted
17. Votive Candles: No restrictions
18. Weddings: No restrictions

Given these relaxed re-opening standards, it is of critical importance that when any parishioner or parishioners are ill, or if a member of their household is ill that such a person or persons should remain at home, and not come to any Church celebrations until they become well. This is to be taken seriously as the pandemic continues to threaten certain communities within Riverside and San Bernardino counties.

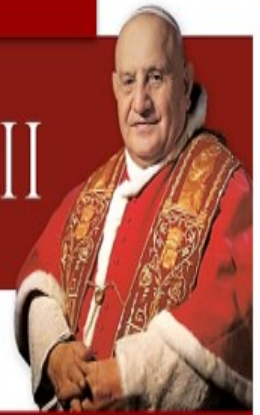
