

Homily Reflection by Fr. Imo

THE ASCENSION MANDATE OF JESUS

In our reflection, we are not going to concern ourselves with the doctrine of Ascension, but the message Jesus gave to his disciples before he went into heaven. “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptize them in the name of the Father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age” (Matt 28:19-20). “Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned (Mark 16:15-16). “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8).

These are the last words of Jesus as recorded differently in Mathew, Mark and Acts. All of them agree that (a) Jesus gave his disciples a mission, a task to engage them till he comes again, and (b) he assured them of divine assistance in the carrying out of this mission. The spreading of the good news is a mission to all who have received the Holy Spirit. Today this mission is going through some difficulties. Is there anything we can do to promote this mission Jesus gave to his church?

Yes! It will begin with a confident belief that as a recipient of the Holy Spirit, it is my call to witness to the word of Jesus. As a child of God, you can help in spreading the good news either by doing it yourself or helping those who do it. You can spread the good news by volunteering to teach catechism, or by joining the choir or any one of the Church ministries. You can help those who do it by praying for them, donating money to train seminarists or sponsor missionary activities, by corporal work of mercy to the poor, needy and homeless, by praying for the health of missionaries and the health of medical personnel who risk their lives to serve those in hospitals.

One thing we must understand is that it is God who does the work. All we need do is to first feed on the word and then make ourselves available for the work. God did not mix words when he said: “Do not allow the book of life to depart from your mouth; you shall meditate on it day and night (Joshua 1:8). In response to this admonition Paul says: “I am not ashamed of the word; for it is the power of God to save those who trust in him” (Rom 1:16). We do not do this mission alone; he has promised to see us through it.

As a matter of fact, when the disciples made themselves available, in spite of their level of education, the kingdom of God began to advance forcefully in the hearts of people. They were able to wake up the souls of those in deep sleep of despair and hopelessness with the transforming power of the word of God. If we too can embrace the word as the power of God to save, read and meditate on it with devotion, we can through the witness of the word and witness change the world.

Let us, therefore, strive to be familiar enough with the Scriptures to be able to present the gospel accurately and coherently to others. “Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have” (1 Peter 3:15). Let us begin to share this hope the Holy Spirit has put in our hearts without any hesitations with our family, siblings, friends, and the sick and suffering during this difficult time.

EL MANDATO DE ASCENSIÓN DE JESÚS

En nuestra reflexión, no nos vamos a ocupar de la doctrina de la Ascensión, sino del mensaje que Jesús dio a sus discípulos antes de ir al cielo. “Por tanto, vayan y hagan discípulos de todas las naciones, bautícelos en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, y enséñele a obedecer todo lo que les he mandado. Y recuerden, yo estaré con ustedes siempre, hasta el fin de los tiempos ”(Mateo 28: 19-20). “Id por todo el mundo y proclamad las buenas nuevas a toda la creación. El que crea y sea bautizado, será salvo; pero el que no crea será condenado (Marcos 16: 15-16). “Pero recibirás poder cuando el Espíritu Santo haya venido sobre ti; y serán mis testigos en Jerusalén, en toda Judea y Samaria, y hasta los confines de la tierra (Hechos 1: 8).

Estas son las últimas palabras de Jesús registradas de manera diferente en Mateo, Marcos y Hechos. Todos coinciden en que (a) Jesús les dio a sus discípulos una misión, una tarea para involucrarlos hasta que él regrese, y (b) les aseguró la asistencia divina en el cumplimiento de esta misión. La difusión de las buenas nuevas es una misión para todos los que han recibido el Espíritu Santo. Hoy esta misión atraviesa algunas dificultades. ¿Hay algo que podamos hacer para promover esta misión que Jesús le dio a su iglesia?

¡Sí! Comenzará con la convicción de que, como receptor del Espíritu Santo, es mi llamado a dar testimonio de la palabra de Jesús. Como hijo de Dios, puede ayudar a difundir las buenas nuevas haciéndolo usted mismo o ayudando a quienes lo hacen. Puede difundir las buenas nuevas ofreciéndose como voluntario para enseñar catecismo o uniéndose al coro o a cualquiera de los ministerios de la Iglesia. Se puede ayudar a quienes lo hacen rezando por ellos, donando dinero para capacitar seminaristas o apadrinando actividades misioneras, con obras corporales de misericordia hacia los pobres, necesitados y sin hogar, orando por la salud de los misioneros y la salud del personal médico que se arriesga. sus vidas para servir a los de los hospitales.

Una cosa que debemos entender es que es Dios quien hace el trabajo. Todo lo que tenemos que hacer es alimentarnos primero de la palabra y luego estar disponibles para el trabajo. Dios no mezcló palabras cuando dijo: “No permitas que el libro de la vida se aparte de tu boca; meditarás en él día y noche (Jesús 1: 8). En respuesta a esta advertencia, Pablo dice: “No me avergüenzo de la palabra; porque es poder de Dios salvar a los que en él confian ”(Rom 1:16). No hacemos esta misión solos; ha prometido ayudarnos a superarlo.

De hecho, cuando los discípulos se hicieron disponibles, a pesar de su nivel de educación, el reino de Dios comenzó a avanzar con fuerza en el corazón de las personas. Pudieron despertar las almas de aquellos en un sueño profundo de desesperación y desesperanza con el poder transformador de la palabra de Dios. Si nosotros también podemos abrazar la palabra como el poder de Dios para salvarla, leerla y meditar en ella con devoción, podemos a través del testimonio de la palabra y el testimonio cambiar el mundo.

Por lo tanto, esforzémonos por estar lo suficientemente familiarizados con las Escrituras para poder presentar el evangelio de manera precisa y coherente a los demás. “Esté siempre preparado para dar respuesta a todo el que le pida que dé la razón de la esperanza que tiene” (1 Pedro 3:15). Comencemos a compartir esta esperanza que el Espíritu Santo ha puesto en nuestros corazones sin ninguna vacilación con nuestra familia, hermanos, amigos y los enfermos y los que sufren durante este momento difícil.

The Ascension of the Lord

There is always something very tender and heartwarming about a kiss. When someone who loves us offers us a kiss, it sends a clear message that we are valued and special. We occupy a unique place in their lives and have a distinct purpose. Kissing celebrates the wonder and beauty of human life. In a very powerful way, we are connected, through intimate touch, with another human being. With the incarnation of Christ, God kissed humanity. God, revealed so perfectly in Jesus Christ, showed us that we have value and are made in God's image and likeness. Mortal human beings radiate with the presence of God and are worthy enough to reveal the intimacy of the Divine Mystery. The human race is not simply something God created from a distance but something special within which God dwells.

It is no wonder then, why the poor hold such an honored place in Jesus' ministry. They speak of God's love and they cry out for the compassion that is due them as children of God. Today's celebration gives us the strength to persevere, knowing that we'll eventually be well. May our hearts be enlightened so that we can know this hope and the surpassing greatness of Christ's power!

Parish Maintenance Report

- Acts of vandalism on Rialto center: unfortunately we have had two break-ins in our Rialto site the past weeks, please help us to report any suspicious persons or activities after office hours at our Rialto church premises by calling the Rialto Police department. In the past months we have replaced a total of 5 broken windows and we have installed a fence around the new image of our Lady of Immaculate Conception prayer garden to avoid acts of vandalism to the statue like happened with the previous image.

- Weed abatement & Tree Trimming: Weed abatement has been performed at the Rialto Church premises and at backyard of the Priest house for the spring season, pending to do is the trimming of the trees at the Resurrection Academy that have sprouted vigorously this year, trimming of these trees will be scheduled soon to avoid any hazards.

Informe de mantenimiento parroquial

- Actos de vandalismo en el centro de Rialto: lamentablemente hemos tenido dos robos en nuestro sitio de Rialto las últimas semanas, ayúdenos a informar sobre cualquier persona o actividad sospechosa fuera del horario de oficina en las instalaciones de nuestra iglesia de Rialto llamando al departamento de policía de Rialto. En los últimos meses hemos reemplazado un total de 5 ventanas rotas y hemos instalado una cerca alrededor de la nueva imagen del jardín de oración de Nuestra Señora de la Inmaculada Concepción para evitar actos vandálicos a la estatua como sucedió con la imagen anterior.


