

Homily Reflection by Fr. Imo

QUIET, BE STILL

We hear in today's first reading the agony of Job and the difficulties facing his household. He was known for being faithful and patient. But in the several chapters preceding the one we read at this Mass; Job's patience ran out of gas. He started complaining and demanding some answers from God as to why he was suffering all these things (Job 3:11; 7:20; 13:3). God's response to his demands came in the form of questions about the mysteries of creation. These questions are meant to lead the reader of the book of Job to a sense of trust that God is in control of all things.

In the Gospel, we also hear the cries of the disciples about to be swallowed up by the storm waves and their complaint about Jesus' seeming insensitivity. This passage of the Gospel describes how at the end of a day of teaching in Jesus' ministry, he entered the boat with his disciples across the sea of Sea of Galilee. As they sailed along, they met severe storm waves. The disciples of Jesus were frightened by the sudden storm while Jesus was sleeping, untroubled by what was going on around him. This Gospel passage describes how Jesus calmed the storm at this Sea of Galilee.

The surprise in the two incidents of Job and the disciples is that before their misfortunes, Job had a good life and happy family and the disciples set out on a cruise with joy after the day's preaching. They did not envisage or foresee any danger – only happiness and great accomplishments. But later in the day the tide turned against them, and they started to learn the big lesson of life, namely, that no accomplishment is easy. It is one thing to desire the gold and another thing to courageously go through the heat of producing it.

How did they respond to their trials? Job responded with agony, anger and agitation. The disciples responded with fear, anxiety and finger pointing. They feared for their lives even though their Lord and Master was with them in the boat. This goes to teach us that trials are intimidating. When they strike, they dispossess their victims and leave them vulnerable. The next thing is to begin to feel abandoned and begin to grumble against God.

Like Job and the disciples, we too have our own problems. Some of us have lost dear ones, property, marriage, job, position, and fortunes, to the pandemic. We still hear the voices of those invaded by the storms of life and the cry of Job in those who are living in fear due to sickness. We feel the cry of Job within ourselves when we become seriously ill or bereaved; when our marriage breaks up or a friend is unjustly treated, when we experience discrimination. At such circumstances we too respond with anger, pointing accusing finger at others or blaming God for our failures. Often, we feel God has abandoned us and threaten to leave the Church.

The good news today is that God has not given up on us. As he heard the disciples overtaken by storm and rescued them, so he still hears us and reaches out to us through the Church. Whenever we encounter trouble, the Lord is there with the same reassuring message: *"It is I, do not be afraid."* What then is needed is not fear but faith. It is a moment to seek the Lord with every fiber of our being, praying, worshipping, and praising him, waiting on him, and standing upon his word whether his Presence is felt or not. Instead of asking why me, as many do, we strive to see our trial as what God can use to strengthen our faith and develop our character; and also strive to accept the truth that God loves us and desires our well-being, our safety, and our joy.

SILENCIO, ESTATE QUIETO

Escuchamos en la primera lectura de hoy la agonía de Job y las dificultades que enfrenta su hogar. Era conocido por ser fiel y paciente. Pero en los varios capítulos que preceden al que leemos en esta Misa; A Job se le acabó la paciencia. Comenzó a quejarse y exigir algunas respuestas de Dios sobre por qué estaba sufriendo todas estas cosas (Job 3:11; 7:20; 13: 3). La respuesta de Dios a sus demandas llegó en forma de preguntas sobre los misterios de la creación. Estas preguntas están destinadas a llevar al lector del libro de Job a un sentido de confianza en que Dios tiene el control de todas las cosas.

En el Evangelio, también escuchamos los gritos de los discípulos a punto de ser tragados por las olas de la tormenta y su queja por la aparente insensibilidad de Jesús. Este pasaje del Evangelio describe cómo al final de un día de enseñanza en el ministerio de Jesús, entró en la barca con sus discípulos al otro lado del mar de Galilea. Mientras navegaban, se encontraron con fuertes olas de tormenta. Los discípulos de Jesús se asustaron por la repentina tormenta mientras Jesús dormía, sin preocuparse por lo que sucedía a su alrededor. Este pasaje del Evangelio describe cómo Jesús calmó la tormenta en este Mar de Galilea.

La sorpresa en los dos incidentes de Job y los discípulos es que antes de sus desgracias, Job tenía una buena vida y una familia feliz y los discípulos partieron en un crucero con alegría después de la predicación del día. No previeron ni previeron ningún peligro, solo felicidad y grandes logros. Pero más tarde en el día la marea se volvió contra ellos, y comenzaron a aprender la gran lección de la vida, a saber, que ningún logro es fácil. Una cosa es desechar el oro y otra cosa es pasar valientemente por el calor de producirlo.

¿Cómo respondieron a sus pruebas? Job respondió con agonía, ira y agitación. Los discípulos respondieron con miedo, ansiedad y acusaciones. Temían por sus vidas a pesar de que su Señor y Maestro estaba con ellos en la barca. Esto nos enseña que las pruebas intimidan. Cuando atacan, despojan a sus víctimas y las dejan vulnerables. Lo siguiente es comenzar a sentirse abandonado y comenzar a quejarse contra Dios.

Como Job y los discípulos, nosotros también tenemos nuestros propios problemas. Algunos de nosotros hemos perdido a seres queridos, propiedades, matrimonio, trabajo, posición y fortunas a causa de la pandemia. Todavía escuchamos las voces de los invadidos por las tormentas de la vida y el grito de Job en los que viven con miedo debido a la enfermedad. Sentimos el grito de Job dentro de nosotros mismos cuando enfermamos gravemente o sufrimos un duelo; cuando nuestro matrimonio se rompe o un amigo es tratado injustamente, cuando experimentamos discriminación. En tales circunstancias, nosotros también respondemos con enojo, acusando a otros con el dedo o culpando a Dios por nuestros fracasos. A menudo, sentimos que Dios nos ha abandonado y amenaza con dejar la Iglesia.

La buena noticia hoy es que Dios no se ha rendido con nosotros. Así como escuchó a los discípulos alcanzados por la tormenta y los rescató, él todavía nos escucha y se acerca a nosotros a través de la Iglesia. Siempre que nos encontramos con problemas, el Señor está allí con el mismo mensaje tranquilizador: *"Soy yo, no temas"*. Entonces lo que se necesita no es miedo, sino Fe. Es un momento para buscar al Señor con cada fibra de nuestro ser, orando, adorándolo y alabándolo, esperando en Él y manteniéndonos firmes en su palabra, se sienta o no su Presencia. En lugar de preguntarnos por qué yo, como muchos lo hacen, nos esforzamos por ver nuestra prueba como lo que Dios puede usar para fortalecer nuestra fe y desarrollar nuestro carácter; y también nos esforzamos por aceptar la verdad de que Dios nos ama y desea nuestro bienestar, nuestra seguridad, y nuestra alegría.

frustration with their children.


Give them warm and open hearts to forgive

VACCINATION PERCENTAGE RATE**WEST END AND SAN BERNARDINO VICARIATES**

The Table below has a message for some of the parishes where the vaccination rates are low. The parishes (**yellow highlight**) are in the 'high-risk' zip code ID for less than 25% vaccination rates. The problem with this is that parishes in yellow may continue to keep the mask requirement and other stringent requirements after the full re-opening until such a time when their zip code exceeds 35% vaccination rate-modicum risk.

Las parroquias (**resaltado en amarillo**) están en el código postal de identificación de "alto riesgo" para tasas de vacunación inferiores al 25%. El problema con esto es que las parroquias en amarillo pueden continuar manteniendo el requisito de la máscara y otros requisitos estrictos después de la reapertura completa hasta el momento en que su código postal supere el 35% de tasa de vacunación, riesgo mínimo.

Re-Opening Guidelines for Worship

Effective June 19, 2021, all parishes within the Diocese of San Bernardino may operate under the sacramental/liturgical/worship guidelines contained as follows:

1. Vaccinated persons may not wear masks in Church.
2. Ushers/volunteers/extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist are strongly encouraged to wear masks when serving.
3. Those serving Communion may now say: "The Body of Christ" to each communicant who then responds, "Amen."
4. Altar Servers can resume – no restriction.
5. Bulletins: No restrictions
6. Hospitality: No self-help; servers continue to wear masks and gloves.
7. Physical Distance: Three (3) feet separation recommended.
8. Offertory: No restrictions
9. Our Father Recitation: Refrain from holding hands with the other person.
10. Private Prayer/Devotion: No restrictions
11. Recessional: No restrictions
12. Sign of Peace: Permitted without any physical contract or touching.
13. Singing by Cantors: No restrictions
14. Singing by Choirs: No restrictions
15. Singing by Assembly: No restrictions
16. Visits to Homebound: Permitted
17. Votive Candles: No restrictions
18. Weddings: No restrictions

Given these relaxed re-opening standards, it is of critical importance that when any parishioner or parishioners are ill, or if a member of their household is ill that such a person or persons should remain at home, and not come to any Church celebrations until they become well. This is to be taken seriously as the pandemic continues to threaten certain communities within Riverside and San Bernardino counties.


