THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Our Christmas celebration continues today with Epiphany by turning our attention toward the world that Jesus came to save. Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus to the Gentiles as the Savior of the world. Today we come like the modern-day magi, following the light and seeking the newborn King. While the rest of the world has already set Christmas aside and moved on to the next thing, we are here today, pondering the great news of God's revelation of himself to humanity. On this day, we celebrate that we are part of that world and we emphasize the glory of the God-man to the world.

In the Old Testament, God revealed himself to the Jews through Abraham but in the New Testament He revealed himself to the Gentile Nations through the Magi from the East. Before this time, God was only known as the God of the Jews while the rest of humanity who did not profess belief in God were seen as pagans. For the Jews, one needed circumcision and purification in order to be acceptable to God. It was when God revealed himself to the Gentiles that He opened the eyes of some of the Jews to see that He is not limited to them alone but He extends to other nations. God only used the Jews as a litmus test to begin the revelation of Himself with the intention to extend it to other Nations through Israel. Even the words of the psalmist in today's Mass are a confirmation of this divine plan, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you" (Ps. 72).

Epiphany teaches us that God is a self-revealing God. The encounter with the magi is not the first time He revealed himself to his people through diverse ways. Just as he used the magi's mode of seeing and interpreting reality to make known his glory in the Child Jesus, He uses different means to reveal himself to us. The good news is that God still reveals himself to his people. In this celebration, the Lord of the universe, who revealed the star of Bethlehem to the Gentiles of the East to enable them to come and worship Jesus, gives each one of us the same light of revelation to recognize and accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior. It is through the help of the Holy Spirit, who moves the heart and opens the eyes of the mind so that we may understand, accept, and believe the truth which God has revealed to us through his Son, Jesus Christ. This is because the human person and his world have the capacity to receive God and his grace.

There is always more to be known about God despite the many revelations committed to writing. This does not pose any surprise because God's knowledge is unfathomable, and what we know is but little. It is in this way that Epiphany teaches us that God still reveals himself to us and invites us to stand up and witness God's presence among us.

So, the good news today is that there is no one standard to measure how God reveals himself to creation. He defied what the Jews knew about him before the birth of Jesus. He revealed himself in the Child Jesus to the shepherds who are keeping watch in the field despite their social stigma. To the magi in the East in spite of their paganism. To Paul, the persecutor of the Church, in spite of his sinful life. He saw in them veritable and selfless instruments to be used to make Himself and his glory known. He can do the same with you. As a God whose ways are "unsearchable" (Rom 11:33), he uses crooked lines to write straight. Our prayers this New Year should be to ask God to open more our eyes to see, our hearts to love and our minds to know Him.

LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

Nuestra celebración navideña continúa hoy con la Epifanía del Señor esta celebración dirige nuestra atención hacia el mundo que Jesús vino a salvar. La Epifanía celebra la revelación de Jesús a los gentiles como el Salvador del mundo. Hoy venimos como los magos de hoy en día, siguiendo la luz y buscando al Rey recién nacido. Mientras que el resto del mundo ya ha dejado la Navideña y ha pasado a lo siguiente, estamos aquí hoy, meditando en la gran noticia de la revelación de Dios a la humanidad. En este día, celebramos que somos parte de ese mundo y enfatizamos la gloria del Dios para el mundo.

En el Antiguo Testamento, Dios se reveló a los judíos a través de Abraham, pero en el Nuevo Testamento se reveló a las naciones gentiles a través de los Magos de Oriente. Antes de este tiempo, Dios solo era conocido como el Dios de los judíos, mientras que el resto de la humanidad que no creía en Dios era visto como paganos. Para los judíos, uno necesitaba circuncisión y purificación para ser aceptable a Dios. Fue cuando Dios se reveló a los gentiles y abrió los ojos de los judíos para ver que no se limita solo a ellos, sino que se extiende a otras naciones. Dios sólo usó a los judíos como una prueba de fuego para comenzar la revelación de sí mismo con la intención de extenderla a otras naciones a través de Israel. Incluso las palabras del salmista en la Misa de hoy confirman de este plan divino; "Señor, toda las naciones en la tierra te adorarán" (Sal. 72).

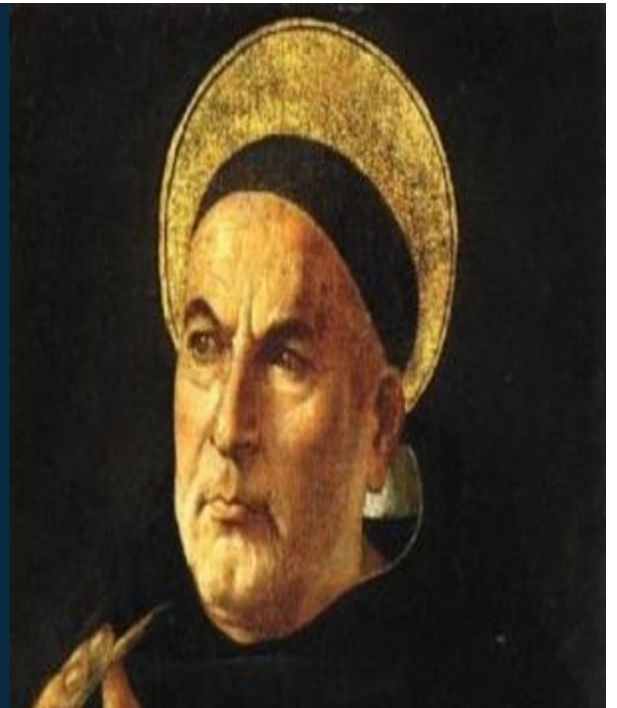
La Epifanía nos enseña que Dios es un Dios que se revela a sí mismo. El encuentro con los magos no es la primera vez que se revela a su pueblo a través de diversas formas. Así como usó el modo de ver y interpretar la realidad de los magos para dar a conocer su gloria en el Niño Jesús, él usa diferentes metodos para revelarse a nosotros. La buena noticia es que Dios todavía se revela a su pueblo. En esta celebración, el Señor del universo, que reveló la estrella de Belén a los gentiles de Oriente para permitirles venir y adorar a Jesús, nos da a cada uno de nosotros la misma luz de revelación para reconocer y aceptar a Jesús como nuestro Señor y Salvador. Es a través de la ayuda del Espíritu Santo, que mueve el corazón, abre los ojos, y permite la mente a venir a entender, aceptar y creer la verdad que Dios nos ha revelado a través de su Hijo, Jesucristo. Esto se debe a que la persona humana y su mundo tienen la capacidad de recibir a Dios y su gracia.

Siempre hay más que aprender acerca de Dios a pesar de las muchas revelaciones comprometidas en las escrituras. Esto no nos toma de sorpresa porque el conocimiento de Dios es insondable, y lo que sabemos es poco. Es de esta manera que la Epifanía nos enseña que Dios todavía se nos revela y nos invita a ponernos de pie y ser testigos de la presencia de Dios entre nosotros.

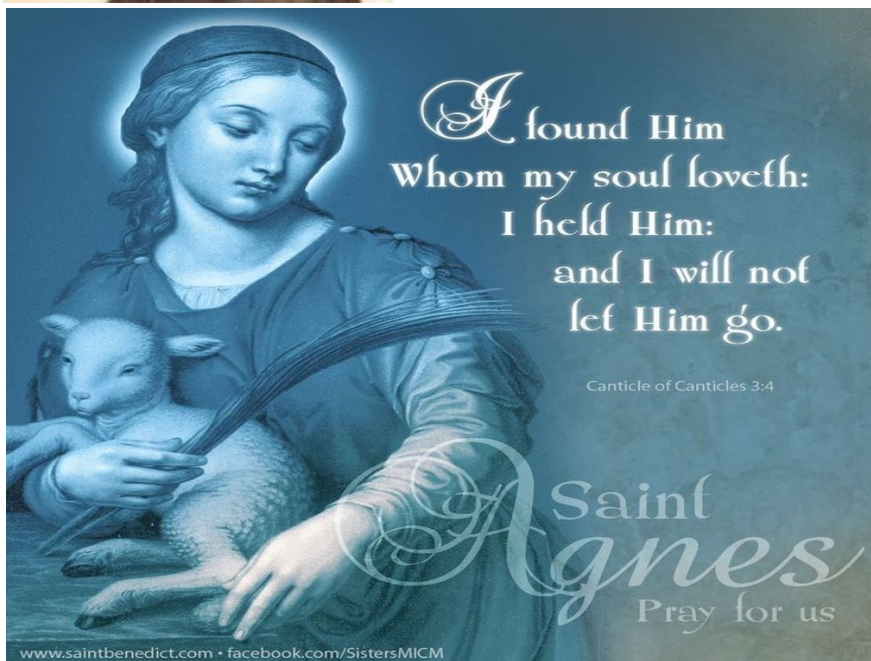
Entonces, la buena noticia de hoy es que no hay solo una manera para medir cómo Dios se revela a su creación. Él supero lo que los judíos sabían de él antes del nacimiento de Jesús. Se reveló en el Niño Jesús a los pastores que vigilan en el campo a pesar de su estigma social. A los magos de Oriente a pesar de su paganismo. A Pablo, el perseguidor de la Iglesia, a pesar de su vida pecaminosa. Vio en ellos la capacidad de ser instrumentos verdaderos y desinteresados para ser utilizados a traer a Dios y su gloria. Él quiere lo mismo con nosotros. Como un Dios con caminos "inescrutables" (Rom 11:33), El usa líneas torcidas para escribir lo recto. Este Año Nuevo oremos a Dios que abra más nuestros ojos para ver, nuestros corazones para amar y nuestras mentes para conocerlo.

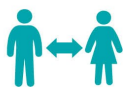

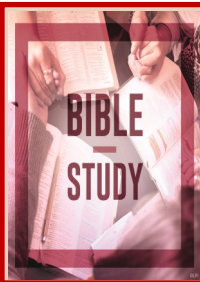
Grupo de Oración Resurrección

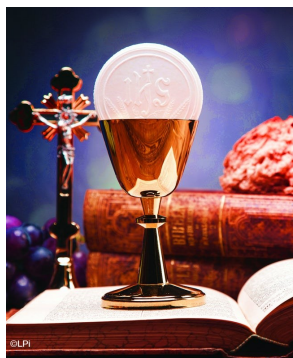
